



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

CLUB HISTORY

The Port Bouvard Surf Lifesaving Club commenced patrols at Pyramids Beach in Dawesville on 18th December 2003. At that time, it started with 21 members of which 9 were active on patrol. The following season in November 2004 the Club commenced a Nipper's program with 18 children aged between 5 and 13 years of age.

On 26th May 2006 the Club gained full affiliation with Surf Life Saving Western Australia (SLSWA). Since that time the Club has gone from strength to strength and is now recognised as a functional Surf Club that is successfully providing a range of services in the Peel Region. These services include, Patrols and Public Safety, Training and Education both for its Members and the General Public, Competition Fitness and Health Programs and Social Interaction.

The Port Bouvard Surf Lifesaving Club is one of 31 Surf Lifesaving Clubs throughout Western Australia, and in the nearby area the Club interrelates with Mandurah, Secret Harbour and Coogee SLS Clubs.

The ground floor (stage one) construction of the Clubrooms at Pyramids Beach was completed in March 2010. The first floor (stage two) construction was completed in July 2019. During the 2021/22 season, the Club was able to fit-out the first floor kitchen area, allowing for commercial caterers to fully utilise the function room, bar and kitchen. The function room has proven popular with the Mandurah Community with a wide range of events being held and raising valuable funds for the club.



Membership Report – *Shae Chalwell*

Total Memberships at Port Bouvard SLSC for the 2022/23 Season was 393. Our Juniors in the Woodside Nippers have decreased marginally to 40% of our memberships but retention for the Cadet/Youth (13-18yr olds) was strong with a 33% growth in numbers.

Once again our Open Day in September was a big success with signing up existing and new members for the season. The remaining memberships were conducted online with SLSWA's upgraded online membership system.

Our third season of Surf Babies proved vvery popular and each session was full with a waiting list. In total, 58 Surf Babies (ages from 2-5 years) joined in fun lessons learning safety in & around the water. This program couldn't run if it wasn't for our volunteer Instructors Adara Storey & Zoe Foster. Thank you for your time & dedication with our youngest generation of Nippers.

PRESIDENTS REPORT - *Cameron Baker*

Welcome members to our 2022/23 season wrap up. Our core business as a surf life saving club is built on the Four Pillars of Lifesaving - Nipper/Youth Development, Surf Sports, Education and Training and Lifesaving. While overall member numbers were down this season, each pillar excelled in delivering our members the support and guidance they needed to improve themselves this season. Thank you all for making this season a positive one for all involved.

Before delving into the pillars of our club, I would like to take a moment to acknowledge the significant role our club house plays as a developing community facility. It has served the wider Mandurah community by offering a space for various gatherings, addressing their diverse needs and facilitating celebrations. Moreover, our club house has not only catered to the community but has also supported the financial requirements of our club, generating a steady income to aid in covering yearly operational costs. With increased demand comes the added responsibility of finding someone to coordinate it all and this wouldn't have been possible without the exceptional efforts of Helen, who has taken on the volunteer role of Events Manager. Thanks to Helen's experience and commitment, and a band of fantastic volunteers, we have been able to host hassle-free events, ensuring that all functions run smoothly and leave a lasting impression on our guests. This role will begin to play a key role in the club's evolution as we enter it's 20th year and I would ask the more business-savvy members to consider becoming more involved with the off beach operations to realise our full potential.

Our youth members were mentored by Michelle and Sue who worked hard to engage and provide additional activities and experiences beyond the beach for our up and coming members. As past nipper parents I thank you for taking on this role and supporting the next chapter of our young members journey in surf life saving. Their efforts saw our large group of Cadets & Youth members engage in team building activities beyond the familiar beach activities, challenging themselves and growing together as mature young adults. They worked together to up-skill their surf lifesaving abilities and supported the club with over 700 hours of volunteer patrol and water safety assistance. Beyond the flags they also found time to compete at Aussies, the premiere Surf Life Saving competition held at Scarborough Beach this year. On the topic of surf sports, several Youth members completed the Junior Officials course and generously volunteered as officials at various carnivals throughout the season. Their commitment to officiating for the next generation reflects the strength and willingness of our club to go above and beyond for each other. As a result of the guidance and support of our Youth leaders, the club was able to put forth a number of worthy candidates to the SLSWA Youth awards. Thank you Michelle, Sue and your band of helpers for supporting the youth this season.

Throughout the season, surf sports training sessions were held on Tuesdays and Saturdays and attracted enthusiastic participants eager to enhance their surf sports skills, both on the beach and in the water. This dedication to training and improvement is commendable and showcases the passion within our Club. The training and commitment paid off come championship time and the Club had several impressive finalists in beach sprints and flags, culminating in an U11 State Gold, well done Jade. Furthermore, our talented Youth members proudly represented our Club at Aussies, competing against top athletes from across the country, providing them with a valuable and memorable experience. Even during the offseason, our Club members remained active in surf sports, participating in events such as IRB racing and the Pool Rescue Championships. Notably, Hiroko and Hitomi, the unstoppable mother-daughter duo, showcased their skills and dedication by securing a total of 8 medals, including 4 gold medals at last years pool rescue championships.

In a drive by SLSWA to retain nipper numbers beyond the metro clubs, our nippers and surf sports leaders engaged in another successful Peel Regional Championships. The goal of these championships, while serving as a qualifying event for the state wide Nipper Championships, is to engage members of neighboring clubs (PB/MH/SH) to come together to provide a fun environment for their nippers to interact with their peers beyond their home club. The morning setup and beach activities ran smoothly, thanks to the dedicated efforts of our nipper parent helpers. Faced with challenging water conditions, the water events were relocated to Town Beach and in a combined club effort managed to get setup and underway without too many hiccups, providing the opportunity for Nippers from different clubs to practice and have fun in the calmer waters.

While numbers in our Woodside Nippers program have settled this season, I want to express my gratitude to all the parents who slipped on the age group manager shirt this season. The role isn't to be the best at everything the kids do on a Sunday morning; it's there to build their confidence, both at the beach and within their age group. It can get pretty full on at times, but this season I could see a culture of safety and encouragement shine through in our AGMs and extend to all involved, I'm extremely proud of how they performed this season. This is where not only our future life savers but also our future club management grow from.



Pyramids Beach poses its fair share of challenges, and I want to extend my appreciation to those who donned the orange rashie every weekend. Your commitment ensured that the nippers could safely enjoy their time in the surf and have a blast. As someone who spent every other weekend on patrol, it was reassuring to know that we had a dedicated group of members looking out for the nippers. Your presence made my time on the water a lot more relaxed knowing I could turn to any one of you for assistance and it be delivered immediately and professionally.

This season we've had a lot of member interest in upskilling and gaining new awards. Thanks to the huge effort of our Director of Education, Elena, our newest SRC and bronze holders graduated from a rigorous course with the assistance of Coogee beach surf club and have been putting their new skills to work at patrols and water safety events. We've had members complete IRB courses and currently have several undertaking an RWC course. A special thanks goes to the power craft trainers as getting up that early to go in the cold water isn't for everyone! For anyone thinking about getting a new qualification make this season the one you go for it - we had a record number of first aid and advance resuscitation courses attended by Port Bouvard members this year, many of them non-patrolling nipper parents or youth looking to assist at water safety events, Surf sports, trainings or even as first aiders on patrol. This kind of involvement is fantastic to see and it is always such a good feeling when members gain a new skill that they might not have even thought themselves capable of. A special mention to Milly, the club's first helicopter crew member. Finding time between study and her role as director of lifesaving to also spend time in the chopper keeping the community safe is a huge achievement.

Our life savers had yet another successful season of Sunday morning patrols. They also teamed up with Mandurah SLSC to provide an Abalone patrol at seascapes on each of the dedicated fishing days. Additionally, our life savers ensured water safety at various swim events, in particular the club's very own cut2club swim ran smoothly. The feedback from the swimmers during those events is always, we felt so safe because you guys were always there. Your commitment is invaluable, and we simply couldn't operate without each and every one of you. Thank you.



The Port Bouvard SLSC Youth Group have had a busy 2022-23 season involving both surf club activities and a number of social events.

This year the youth comprised almost 50 percent of the total rostered patrolling members for the club, a huge responsibility on young shoulders. We as members of Port Bouvard SLSC can all play a role in mentoring and supporting the youth who juggle school, family commitments, together with other sporting activities to give time and effort to our club. As Directors of Youth this season Michelle and I wanted to reward their dedication and commitment by facilitating a number of fun get togethers.

We started the season by coming together to discuss the types of activities the youth were interested in attending and provide details of the Surf Lifesaving youth pathways programs. Here the current youth were able to meet and mix with new youth members, while partaking in some snacks and refreshments.

In November, we met at Avalon Beach for a bbq and catch-up, where new members were presented with their SRC certificates and a 'Pharaohs' hoodie, kindly sponsored by Melissa Martin (previous Director of Youth) and Eric Fawcett.

For the second outing we attended an evening session at laser blaze, where they had a 'blast' running around shooting at each other, all in good fun.

In March they gathered at Adventure World for 'Fright Night', and spent over 3 hours enjoying the water slides, rides and just hanging out together. Exhausted, they were driven home, arriving back in Mandurah at midnight.

During the last activity they tackled the high ropes at Dwellingup Treetop Adventures, followed by a bbq lunch and chilly dip in lane pool. Thanks to the SES for use of their bus, which enabled the group to socialise on the way to and from this and other activities.

This season members of the youth group have qualified in Surf Rescue, Bronze Medallion, First Aid and IRB crew, expanding their existing skills. A number of the new youth completed youth officials training, enabling them to assist at surf sports carnivals. Our youth have volunteered over 713 hours for patrol and water safety, which includes support to our Nippers program, giving up their time on weekends and evenings.

We also had 3 youth members represent Port Bouvard by competing at the Aussies Surf Lifesaving championships in Scarborough, well done.

The SLSWA Toad youth camp provided an opportunity for one member to connect with other SLSC youth members, over 4 days at Hillarys. Community events including the Cut to Club swim, local school beach carnivals, RSL Duck Race and Anzac Day were also well supported by our youth.

Nominations were provided by the club for the SLSWA Youth Awards, under 14/15 lifesaver of the year (Euan Laird), and youth club achiever (Leo Griffith), who was selected as a finalist. The Port Bouvard SLSC Awards, most promising youth members under 15 were, Zoe Martin and Euan Laird and under 17 were, Zara McCaugh and Leo Griffith. Congratulations, we are proud of all our youth members, who help to make Port Bouvard the great club it is. Thanks to the committee for their ongoing support.


LIFESAVING SNAPSHOT – *Amelia Cleveland*

Thank you all for a fantastic year in lifesaving. As my first year in the role as Director of Lifesaving I found it a little overwhelming at times but thanks to the help of other current and previous board members we were able to achieve some amazing things I am very proud of.

I believe our largest achievement this season was the increase in active patrol members by 31%, this assisted me in creating 4 teams instead of our previous three. Not only does this reduce the load on current members it is encouraging of those looking to make the jump to patrol, reducing the commitment required, something that will assist us to keep those numbers increasing. Many members took on new roles this year as patrol captains and vice captains, congratulations I was extremely proud of your growth, efforts and commitment. The success of these developing members is due to the great work by the senior mentors, to you I am very grateful, I hope you enjoyed passing on your knowledge to the next generation of patrol captains.

Secondly this year has seen us continue working towards our goal of assisting nippers in becoming a self-sufficient department, in terms of water safety. For this I am extremely grateful to all those who have put their hand up to complete NRC, SRC and bronze courses, with the intention of helping out at nippers, parents or otherwise. Along this line we have also continued to support the club financially through providing external water safety and abalone patrols, these events provide great opportunity for the club and provide us money which we can reinvest on lifesaving equipment and training for members.

I'll leave you with some statistics from this seasons. We performed 2 rescues (2 tube, 1 other), 16 first aids, 437 preventative actions, 2440 patrol hours and identified 109 rips, thanks to our 74 patrolling members.

This Season our Club hosted the Peel Regional Championships, which, for the second year running has been used as a qualifier for the Nipper Championships. The conditions on the sand were perfect, with thanks to all those that helped set up and have the arenas looking professional. Unfortunately, in true Pyramids fashion, the swell showed up deeming the conditions too treacherous for water events to commence. At the completion of the beach events, it was a quick scramble and relocation to Town Beach. Once set up on Town Beach it was easy to see the right decision was made when all the Nippers from different Clubs were practicing and having fun in the calm waters. It really was a team effort from all three Peel Clubs who came together to pull off a great Regional Champs. Our Nippers from Port Bouvard SLSC came away with multiple medals and automatic entry into the Nippers Championships.

Special mention to our Youth members under the guidance of Patrick who completed their Junior Officials course through SLSWA and volunteered their weekends to officiate at multiple carnivals. It's great to see our small Club providing so many officials at carnivals.

Training was held throughout the Season, every Tuesday & Saturday and was well attended for those interested in improving in Surf Sports skills on the beach and in the water. Thanks for all those who helped out on training days.

This year we saw a different format of the Nipper Championships held over separate weekends for beach and water events. 

