



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


CLUB HISTORY

The Port Bouvard Surf Lifesaving Club commenced patrols at Pyramids Beach in Dawesville on 18 December 2003. At that time, it started with 21 members of which 9 were active on patrol. The following season, in November 2004, the Club commenced a Nipper's program with 18 children aged between 5 and 13 years of age.

On 26 May 2006 the Club gained full affiliation with Surf Life Saving Western Australia (SLSWA). Since that time the Club has gone from strength to strength and is now recognised as a functional Surf Club that is successfully providing a range of services in the Peel Region. These services include patrols and public safety, training and education for members and the general public, competition fitness and health programs; and social interaction.

The Port Bouvard Surf Lifesaving Club is one of 31 Surf Lifesaving Clubs throughout Western Australia, and in the nearby area the Club interrelates with Mandurah, Secret Harbour and Coogee Surf Lifesaving Clubs.

The ground floor (stage one) construction of the clubrooms at Pyramids Beach was completed in March 2010. The first floor (stage two) construction was completed in July 2019. The addition of a second storey to the clubrooms has proven popular with the Mandurah community with a wide range of events being held and raising valuable funds for the club.




CLUB VISION AND OBJECTIVES

Membership Report – *Kelsey Black*



I extend my sincere gratitude to them for their invaluable support in helping me navigate my first year as President. I would also like to express my appreciation to the outgoing board and committee members for their dedication and hard work throughout the past season.

Our Woodside Nippers participation has remained steady, and it's fantastic to see the nippers on the beach each Sunday morning, pushing themselves and embracing the surf lifesaving culture. Under the leadership of our Director of Education, Jeff Kallawk, our patrol numbers continue to grow, with members successfully completing SRC, Bronze, and Silver Medallion courses. Congratulations to all the candidates on their achievements!


The annual Cut 2 Club, as mentioned previously, is in its 5th year. This is a major event for the club and continues to prove popular every year, giving participants the opportunity to swim the Dawesville channel. 

CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT – *Phillip Laird*

Taking on the role of Club Captain for the year, I viewed it as a challenge to explore new ways of volunteering my time to the club and our activities. Firstly, I would like to acknowledge the invaluable contributions of all who have so willingly given over their time to the running of our beach and waterside activities for the year.

We put out reds and yellows on in October as we have done many times before, and we set out on our patrolling journey for the season 2023/24. Over the duration of the season, we've been active in many different areas, locations and arenas. We've added patrolling cadets and members, added to our skills and knowledge base, stepped outside of our comfort zone but more importantly we've done it as a Port Bouvard SLSC.

We've provided patrol services to the Peel region, again for the year, at both Pyramids Beach and Falcon Bay, across four patrol teams for the 22 patrol days for the year. 

Helping with building the club's main event, The Cut 2 Club, we had another successful water safety year. Being able to provide support to an important club event and be a visible face for the competitors to trust that we're there for them is an important contribution to the ongoing success of the event.

Additionally, we sent water safety, (powercraft operators, bronze medallion, SRC and NRC) to the regular scheduled competitions for the year, the Country Champs and Regional Carnivals. This dedication is crucial in nurturing the growth and development of our Nippers. Beyond our club activities, we extended our support to various community events by providing IRBs for the Down Wind paddlers, assisting with The Abalone Patrols in collaboration with Mandurah SLSC. Also, we were able to provide water safety for a number of school beach days and private functions.

Reflecting on the year and the volunteer efforts that contributed to our success, I am grateful to everyone who dedicated their time to make this season memorable. These collective efforts are the foundation upon which we build Port Bouvard SLSC.

Conditions remained fabulous over the summer with warm flat water and mild wind at Pyramids Beach.



We have now finalised the audit of the Port Bouvard Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the Club) records of account for the 12 months ending 30 April 2024 and enclose the financial statements and audit report. This is a privileged communication for the exclusive use of those to whom it is addressed, and must not be published or copied without our prior approval.

As part of our procedure we provide the following report on our findings. These comments and suggestions below are made to facilitate an increase in the efficiency and effectiveness of the Club's accounting controls and are for the committee's consideration.

Asset Register

It has been noted that the asset register of the Club has been maintained and updated during the year and reconciles to the value of assets disclosed on the balance sheet provided by the Club.

Matters For Your Attention


We note that although policies and procedures are being implemented to improve the internal controls in the Club's accounting processes the following issues are highlighted for the Committees consideration and we strongly recommend that the Club continues to adopt new and improved practices:

- Bank Reconciliations

As per the previous audit, these need to be performed at least monthly on all bank accounts, reviewed and signed off by someone independent of the preparer. It would appear that the bank reconciliations in Myob for bank accounts have been 'completed' as at 31 December 2024. Please ensure that all bank accounts are reconciled in Myob at least on a monthly basis.

We strongly recommend that the comments in this management letter and the audit report are made available to all committee members and the audit report and management letter comments are kept in mind when reporting to the members at each AGM.

We received courteous assistance and prompt attention to our questions from Tanya Turner, which enabled us to complete the audit in the timeframe allowed.





NOTES TO THE SPECIAL PURPOSE FINANCIAL REPORT


NOTE 1: Accounting Policies

This special purpose financial report was prepared to fulfil the Port Bouvard Surf Lifesaving Club Inc.'s (the organisation) reporting requirements under its constitution. The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as discussed below, are in the opinion of the organisation, appropriate to fulfil the requirements of its constitution and the needs of its members.

- (a) The financial report was prepared on a cash basis of accounting, including the historical cost convention.
- (b) The requirements of accounting standards and other professional reporting requirements in Australia do not have mandatory applicability to the organisation because it is not a 'reporting entity'. Therefore the organisation has not prepared the financial report in accordance with any Australian accounting standards.

Note 2: Economic Dependency

The ongoing operation of the services provided by the Club and the ability to continue as a going concern is dependent upon the continued receipt of funding from sponsorship/fundraising events and upon the continued support of its members.

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Port Bourvard Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. (the organisation), which comprises the income and expenditure statement for the year ended 30 April 2024, the balance sheet as at 30 April 2024, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the Certification by the Committee for the period then ended.

The Organisation's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The organisation is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and has determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 is appropriate to meet the requirements of the constitution and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The committee's responsibilities also includes such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence


In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Qualification

As is common for organisations for this type, it is not practicable for to maintain an effective system of internal control over income and expenses prior to their initial entry into the accounting records, and therefore, no opinion is expressed on the accuracy of these amounts. However, all amounts recorded as deposits and payments have been properly reflected in the financial report. Accordingly our audit procedures were limited to the amounts recorded in the books of accounts. We have not verified the existence nor value of the fixed assets as shown on the balance sheet but have relied upon information provided to us by the finance officer.

Opinion

In our opinion, subject to the effects on the financial reports of the above qualification, if any, the financial report is based on proper accounts and presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the



Port Bouvard Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2024 and of its financial performance for the period then ended in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of its constitution.

Basis of Accounting and Restriction of Distribution




